

The Golly Checklist is widely recognized as the authoritative guide to all items connected to the Robertsons' Golly. It was produced following extensive research carried out since the 1980's and covers the vast majority of golly related items ever produced by Robertson's – now in more detail than ever before. Collectors regularly contact the Golly Checklist team with items of interest and these are collated and used in future updates. This document has been setup to capture this information to enable all collectors to see what items are currently being investigated and encourage you to feed into it.

This Log is divided into different sections to enable you to focus on any area in which you have a particular interest. Due to the popularity of the badges, each badge 'era' is given its own section. The first item in each badge section relates to quality control issues. This is an attempt to maintain a record of all known mispaints, mis-stamps, colour over-runs, off-cuts and unenamelled badges which have made their way onto the collectors market. Whilst these are genuine items and make an interesting addition to any collection they were not originally intended for distribution and are therefore they are beyond the scope of the official Golly Checklist. They are essentially 'one-offs', but by maintaining a record of them it will help novice collectors to identify genuine items from any counterfeits and may also help identify any new variations that should be in the Checklist (i.e. if it an item reported from multiple independent sources, and is confirmed as being issued over a batch as happened with the 1990's Snowflake Skier 149aR). Once a good selection has been recorded, the intention is to make this information freely available to collectors in the form of an online 'Log Book'. Beyond the badges, the sections of this log correspond to those in the Checklist. This log is expected to grow over time as more information is fed in.

The content may be technical in nature as it is aimed at the experienced collector. No attempt will be made to explain any technical terms or abbreviations that are commonly used and well defined in the Golly Checklist (such as Dies, backstamp types, W/W etc). New collectors are advised to become familiar with the Golly Checklist first.

Finally, it was only possible to put The Golly Checklist together with the input and enthusiasm of many collectors over the years, and it is hoped that this will long continue. Collectors are encouraged to feedback on any item with which they may be able to assist (ideally with clear high resolution images on a pale blue background), to query any aspect of the checklist that is not clear or to volunteer other topics for further research. 0000	Prewar Quality Control	The Miller enamels of the prewar era were produced under strict quality control and so there are very few examples of mispaints, over-runs, offcuts or unenamelled designs. It would be useful to hold a record of any that do exist so they can be referred to in future research as necessary.
0001	Miller Prewar Golfer Backstamps	In the early days Miller were known to have used a number of different stampings across their prewar golfer badges. As they were 'registered' designs (which means they were registered at the patent office), many included the registration number on reverse. Variations of this include stamps with only REGD or REGD APPD. Further variations include a design where REGD has been stamped as a mirror image, and an example of a golfer exists with COPYRIGHT on reverse. Although the backstamps on the majority of issued prewar badges is well catalogued it is possible that some unusual stampings or variations exist.
0002	Prewar Fruit Backstamps	Investigate all backstamps on prewar fruits to confirm all variations have been captured.
0003	Miller Prewar Footballers	A number of Miller prewar footballers exist with white v-necks. Were these produced across all coloured footballs? Were they produced in both metal hands/feet and white hands black feet varieties? What backstamp do each have? ? Early promotional leaflets list a brown and white footballer – does this actually exist?
0004	Miller Prewar Cricketer	The plain Miller cricketer is known to have been produced in type IB i and type IB ii backstamps. Do any other backstamp variations exist on this badge?
0005	Prewar Raspberry	This badge comes in 2 Dies, what backstamp variations occur on each Die? Which one is the rarer? Do you have any in your collection, if so, which one?
0006	GREENS Footballer Backstamps	There are three types of the GREENS backstamp. Which ones can be found on the Prewar Footballer?

1000	W/W Quality Control	The high demand for golly badges during the white waistcoat era resulted in a large number of manufacturers being involved with varying degrees of quality control. As a result there are a significant number of genuine badges that fall into the 'Quality Control' category. If you have one please let us know about it.
1001	Gomm Dies	Eleven different golly designs were issued during the White Waistcoat era, and Gomm was the only manufacturer to have produced every one (helped by the fact that they were sole manufacturers of the Lollipopman). Further study of the Gomm badges shows that every design they made can be found in 2

		Dies with the exception of the Bagpiper, Footballer, Hockey and Skater (note: the Bagpiper and Skater do have two different 'GS' backstamps on reverse but the Die from which they were stamped appears identical). As these were some of the most popular white waistcoat badges this seems to be a bit of an anomaly and a good place to investigate to determine if a second Die was in fact used across all designs.
1002	Fattorini [3]	The Fattorini bobble back stamping [Fattorini type 3] is one of the more attractive backstamps and only occurs on the white waistcoat Standard. It is currently catalogued as 4 different variants [3a-1], [3a-2], [3a-3] & [3a-4]. However it has recently been discovered that variations exist within this – in particular in relation to the patterns of the bobbles on reverse. How many there are is not yet known and requires further investigation.
1003	Fattorini [5] variations	The F&S backstamp is known in a wide and narrow format across many of the W/W designs. This distinction will be explicitly made in the 7 <sup>th</sup> version of the Golly Checklist. Given this research is fairly recent, it may be possible that not all examples have been recorded. Is the complete range of stampings known or do others exist which have not been recorded? Is it sufficient to classify them as simply 'wide' and 'narrow' or do further variations exist within this classification? (The issue of horizontal or vertical backstamp alignment of this backstamp is dealt with in item 1015).
1004	Fattorini [6] variations	The F&S B'HAM backstamp appears to vary in thickness of stamping across different designs - particularly type 6A. Are there any further unrecorded variations?
1005	Fattorini 'very' dark blue	A number of Fattorini designs are known to exist in a much darker shade of blue that is clearly distinct from the usual light and dark shades. Were these produced in significant numbers or one-off's? Were they produced across all designs or with specific backstamps? Is there any consistency to this variation?
1006	Standard – Gomm Empire in Chrome	What is the backstamp type on this design. Type I iii or Type I iv (empire raised or punched in)?
1007	Standard – Greens BLACK hands	Does this also have black feet? What is the backstamp type? Image needed for the guide.
1008	Gaunt - large and small	Gaunt backstamps are known on the cricketer in two sizes - large and small. Gaunt also made four other designs (Standard, Footballer, Skater and Tennis Player). Do these designs also have the backstamp in two sizes?
1009	Reeves Footballer - Silver and Gold effect	The Reeves footballer is known in distinct metallic shades of silver and gold. Were they both produced across a whole batch?

1010	Propat backstamps	The Propat Standard occurs with backstamp in box and without box. The Skater has only been reported in a version with backstamp in box - does it also exist in a version without a box?
1011	Bagpiper Red Shoulder	A number of Bagpipers are known with red shoulders. Is this enamel over run from the red pipes or did it occur consistently? Known to affect Fattorini Bagpipers, does it occur with other makers?
1012	Bagpiper – Fattorini [8]	Which Die was this produced in? Die A, B or C?
1013	Miller – b/s alignment	The Miller backstamp can be found with a horizontal or vertical alignment, and the vertical alignment may be rotated 90° clockwise or anti-clockwise - is there any consistency of alignment across designs, are all badge designs which have the miller stamp available with all alignments?
1014	Gomm – b/s alignment	The Gomm backstamp can be found with a horizontal or vertical alignment. Is there any consistency of alignment across designs, are all badge designs which have the Gomm stamp available with both H & V alignments?
1015	Fattorini – b/s alignment	The Fattorini backstamp can be found with a horizontal or vertical alignment – particularly the F&S [type 5]. Is there any consistency of alignment across designs, are all badge designs with the F&S and other Fattorini stamps available with all alignments.
Gollv	Badges: 1970's e	era
2000	1970's Quality Control	Quality Control was not particularly strong during this period - especially across Gomm's designs. We would be interested in building up a record or all known variations which fall under the 'quality control' category from this period.
2001	Gomm 70's dark blue batch	The dark blue jackets on the 1970's Gomm badges has so far been found on 7 of the 11 1970's designs. All of these have the "B'HAM 1" stamp. Whilst it does not apply to the lollipopman - which has a white coat - does it occur on the remaining three designs in this series? Unlikely to occur on Motorcyclist and Skateboarder but no dark blue Tennis player has been found – does the Tennis player exist in dark blue? Do any of them have the "B'HAM" stamp?
2002	1970's Motorcylist	This design is usually found without enamel in the headlights and goggles, but examples exist with one or more of these additional areas enamelled. Is there any consistency here? Please let us know if you have any variations on this design.
2003	1970's Fattorini Bagpiper	The usual yellow colour on the waistcoat of the 1970's designs are a 'custard' yellow shade which is the same across all manufacturers, the one exception to this is the Fattorini Bagpiper which was issued with a 'lemon' yellow shade (both
