Section	Golly Badges: W/W era
Title	.R. White Waistcoat Standard
Description	The Standard badge from the White Waistcoat era with the ‘.R.’ backstamp (i.e. R with dots, shown as Type 1 in the checklist) has always been one of the more difficult backstamps to find. A closer analysis of the backstamp has shown that at least two different versions are known. Is this the full extent or are there any more?
Further Detail	<p>The images below show the two variations clearly. The most noticeable differences between the two backstamps are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The space between the righthand leg of the R and the righthand dot is different. 2. The size and shape of the R internal top loop is different. (Different R) 3. Most noticeably, the Current Guide listed type 1 has dots that are more like vertical dashes, with the left hand being much larger, whereas the new stamp has perfectly round dots. <p>If you have this badge and can add to this area of research please contact us at the Golly Checklist by emailing: info@gollychecklist.co.uk</p>
